

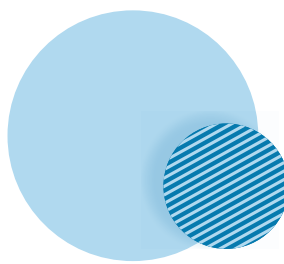
# THE RESULTS OF GoAL WaSH Programme in Kyrgyzstan 2013-2014



## Millennium Development Goals

Goal 7, Target 3

Halve, by 2015, the proportion of the population without sustainable access to safe drinking water and basic sanitation.



### National Sustainable Development Strategy of the Kyrgyz Republic for the period of 2013-2017.

One of the main strategic directions of social policy of the Kyrgyz Republic is to provide the population and other consumers with tap water and sewage.

**Objective of the Programme:** Rural and urban communities in Kyrgyzstan have sustainable and equitable access to safe drinking water and sanitation (DWSS) by improving the legal environment and management capacity at the national and local levels.

✓ **4 pilot communities were selected**  
in the south regions of Kyrgyzstan: Salamalik and Kara-Kulja local communities of Osh region, Dara and Kara-Bak local communities of Batken region

✓ **5 demonstration WASH projects were implemented**
